

The Setup

Two brothers, one is nice, one is kind. Joseph Surface studies sentiment and is loved by almost everyone. His brother Charles is bankrupting himself with his spendthrift ways. Charles is interested in Maria, Joseph in Maria's inheritance. Lady Sneerwell, still desiring Charles who has snubbed her, is helping Joseph by having Sir Peter Teazle find love letters forged by Snake between Charles and Peter's recent wife. As well, Sneerwell ensures Maria sees Charles' old love letters to herself.
Meanwhile, the brothers' uncle Sir Oliver Surface is returned from sixteen years in India. Having supported his nephews all this time, he wishes to test their characters in the guise of poor cousin Stanley asking them both for money. Their family steward Rowley instead advises Oliver to dress as a moneylender Premium who Charles is expecting but has never met. Hilarity ensues.

Stephen Cox (Sir Oliver Surface) is delighted to be making his fifth onstage appearance with the Rude's since playing the title role of "Macbeth" for their second production in 2000. He has also acted and directed in over two dozen GAC shows from 1992 (before it was in this current space) through 2010. His next project is directing GAC's November production of "The Importance of Being Earnest".
